CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

How to Register for Classes: You may select your classes online or return a Class Selection Sheet to the camp office.

Camp Fees Due Date: If regular camp fees are not paid in full by June 12, class registration codes will not be sent until camp balances have been paid.

Camp Week 1

LIFESKILLS CLASSES

Auto Mechanics: Learn the basics of caring for a vehicle, from basic troubleshooting and maintenance to emergency procedures and pre-travel inspections. Class will cover belts and hoses, fluids and leaks, tires and brakes. **Bring:** Old clothes or coveralls. **Instructor:** Evyn Wollmann.

Beekeeping: Have you ever wondered what it's like to take care of a hive of honeybees, and have your own supply of fresh honey? Would you like to learn about what goes on inside a hive, what equipment is needed for successful beekeeping, and how to extract your own honey? Even if you think bees are a little scary, this class will show you how easy beekeeping is, and just how gentle bees can be. **Instructor:** Rob Norris.

We'll show you how to see without being seen, how to walk without making a sound, and how to think more like the creatures you want to see more (or less) of in the woods. **Instructor:** Rob Norris.

Amateur Radio: How will you communicate when the power grid goes down, cell phones fail, and the internet crashes. Discover the fascinating hobby of Ham Radio that "works in the wilderness where cell phones don't" and "when everything else fails." Work toward getting your own FCC Technician's Class Amateur Radio License. Students who sign up early will be e-mailed the information to study for the FCC Test. Those who put in 10+ hours of self-study before coming to YD may have a good chance to pass the official FCC licensure exam which we hope to be able to offer during YD Camp (\$15 FCC Fee, Legal Photo ID & SS# required). Other activities include: Tips and formulas for taking the FCC test, learning radio lingo including the universal NATO Phonetic Alphabet, getting on the air for a live QSO (radio communication) with someone across the country or around the world, constructing a portable "tape measure" beam antenna, and joining in a "Hidden Transmitter Fox Hunt" to use radio location to find a disguised radio beacon in the woods. **Class fee:** \$10 (plus \$15 for FCC Testing). **Instructor:** Rob Neall.

Canoeing: No summer would be complete without a paddle and a canoe! Instruction in strokes, maneuvers, and safety will have you skimming across beautiful Lake Roosevelt in no time. **What to wear:** *Boys:* long T-shirt & knee-length shorts. *Girls:* fingertip-length shirt over knee-length shorts. **Prerequisite:** Intermediate swimming certificate or ability to swim 100 yards. **Instructors:** Alex Munson and Jessica Munson.
